Amusements and occupations are largely employed to train the little ones in habits of observation and order, and *their senses are educated*, while no strain is put upon their mental or physical energies. The Kinder-garten system is universally adopted in Germany as introductory to the School proper. At six years of age the children go into the "Transition Class," which prepares them for the School, which they enter at seven. This system has, wherever adopted, been found to be a great success both in making little children happy, and in preparing them and laying a thorough foundation for their after Schoolwork.

*A Lady specially trained at the Kinder-garten Training College, and holding a First Class Certificate, superintends the work of this Department.*

#### THE CAMBRIDGE PUBLIC FREE LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

Was established in the year 1855, and has since been supported by a Penny Borough Rate. The Central Lending Library, situate at the back of the Guildhall, contains 15,050 volumes, the Central Reference Library 6,619 vols., whilst there are 3,078 vols. in the Barnwell Branch Library in East Road, making a total of 24,747 vols. The Central Reading Room (the entrance to which is in Wheeler Street, opposite the New Corn Exchange), is plentifully supplied with newspapers, magazines, maps, and such books of reference as Directories, Peerages, House of Commons, Clergy Lists, Army Lists, &c. There are also 920 volumes in the room which may be used, but not taken away by the public without any formal application for permission or written order. This plan of placing a number of books at the free disposal of anyone who likes to use them, has been found to be highly appreciated, and seldom if ever abused. The Barnwell Reading Room is a comfortable building on the East Road, and should command even more use than it receives. The issue of books last year (1879-80) to readers in the room and to borrowers was 10,409. The number of Visitors to the Library was 56,443. The total number of borrowers at the Central Library last year was 14,369. Mr. John Pink is the Librarian.—*Spalding's Handbook*, 1881.

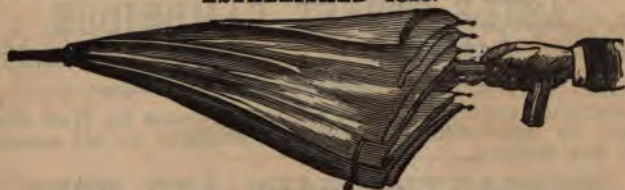

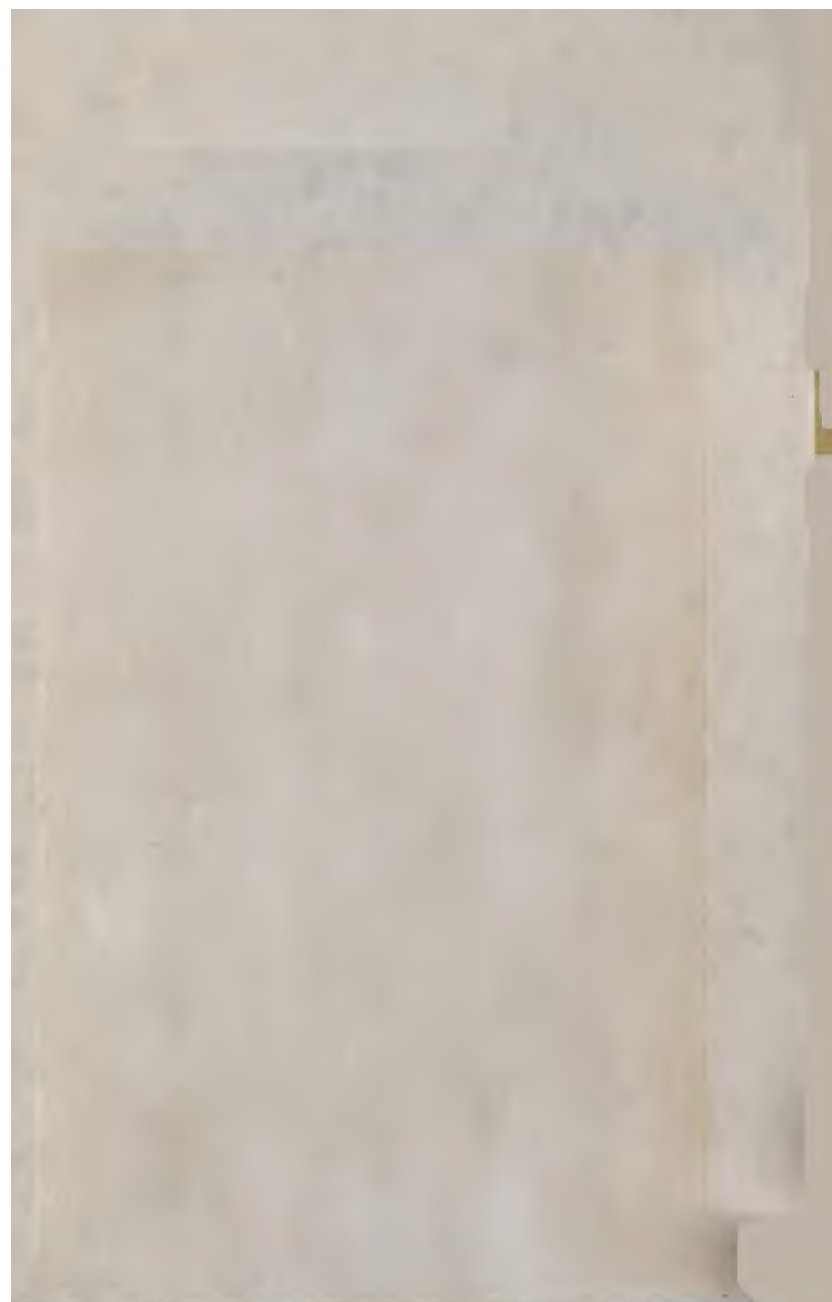
